As a result of its inspection of the Federal Mediation and Conciliation Service (FMCS) ethics program, the Office of Government Ethics (OGE) issued six recommendations in its January 2017 inspection report. OGE recently conducted a follow-up review to assess whether FMCS has taken sufficient action to resolve the deficiencies underlying these recommendations. The results of the follow-up review are summarized below.

Subsequent to OGE's onsite visit, FMCS destroyed all reports that had been retained for more than six years. Therefore, OGE is not issuing a recommendation.  (5.5) Three employees were required to file new entrant reports in 2016. This includes two employees who were promoted into new positions in early-to-mid 2016, but were not notified timely of the filing requirement. Both employees filed reports subsequent to OGE's onsite visit as a result of OGE's inquiries to identify new entrants during 2016.  (5.7) Of the 33 confidential reports that OGE reviewed, 28 reports (85%) were certified late.
