Preventing Conflicts of Interest in the Executive Branch

As a result of its review of the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) ethics program, the Office of Government Ethics (OGE) issued five recommendations in its June 2016 review report. Due to an extensive reorganization of their ethics program, which involved significant structural and personnel changes, BLM twice asked to postpone their initial follow up review to allow time to implement changes. OGE conducted the initial follow-up review in May 2020 but was only able to close three of the five recommendations at that time. OGE recently conducted a second follow-up review. The results are summarized below.
