1	3.9	RECOMMENDATION: Ensure new entrant public financial disclosure reports are filed on time. AGENCY RESPONSE: The Agency has taken steps to address this recommendation. In February, we hired a new attorney on our Administrative Law & Ethics team and immediately trained her on completing OGE 450 reviews. We have also assigned two management analysts to assist in triaging 450s and clearing those that have no assets reported under the direction of the Agency's Chief Ethics Officer. Of the 1560 annual reports submitted for CY2020, we certified 80% within 60 days. In addition to the 80% certified, another 11% were reviewed within 60 days and have required additional information. This puts us at a 91% review rate within 60 days. We are actively working with filers on the remaining reports that have not yet been certified to obtain the necessary information. Supervisor signatures are also required before a report can be certified, which can cause some delay. Our Ethics Program Manager continues to actively work with the Agency POCs and supervisors to get their signatures on reports so we can close them as well. Of the 199 New Entrant reports filed in CY2020, all but 2 were reviewed within 60 day (the 2 reports not within the 60-day window were reviewed at 62 and 86 days) and 133 of those reports have been certified. The remainder of the reports are either within the 60-day certification window or we are actively working with filers and supervisors to complete the reports for certification. OGE COMMENT: OGE will conduct a follow-up review in approximately May 2021, to assess whether DISA has taken sufficient action to resolve the deficiencies underlying the recommendation.	May 2021
