AGENCY RESPONSE: During CY 2023 the NMB made several changes to the Administrators/Reviewers within its Integrity System. Implementation of these changes resulted in designated Reviewers and Administrators not receiving notifications of reports that needed agency review and experiencing difficulty accessing reports needing review. The reports were certified as soon as ethics officials discovered they were pending agency review. NMB Ethics officials are working with the Integrity Help Desk to resolve these issues and ensure that the ethics officials receive notification and access to all Public Financial Disclosure Forms so that they can be reviewed and certified in a timely manner.
