OGE's review found that 47% received initial ethics training and 45% received it timely.

DeCA informed OGE during this inspection that new employees will immediately being receiving initial ethics training through LMS, which is currently used for annual ethics training. DeCA provided OGE with a copy of the LMS ethics training, which was found to be interactive.  AGENCY RESPONSE: Provided copy of interactive LMS training to OGE.
