Dear Mr. Brooker:

As a result of its review of the Office of the Director of National Intelligence's (ODNI) ethics program, the Office of Government Ethics (OGE) issued two recommendations in its October 2017 inspection report. OGE recently conducted a follow-up review to determine whether ODNI has taken sufficient action to resolve the deficiencies underlying the recommendations. Based on the results of our follow-up review, OGE has determined that both recommendations are now closed. The results of our follow-up review are summarized below.

2	Ensure that new entrant confidential reports are filed timely.	During the follow-up review, OGE also examined 13 new entrant confidential financial disclosure reports that were filed in 2018. Of the 13 reports examined, 12 (92%) were filed timely. This also represents a significant improvement from our October 2017 inspection finding OGE identified that only 20% of the sampled confidential reports examined were filed timely.	Closed
