As a result of its review of the Department of Health and Human Services Office of the Secretary's ethics program, the Office of Government Ethics (OGE) issued two recommendations in its July 2024 program review report. OGE conducted a follow-up review to assess whether the HHS has taken sufficient action to resolve the deficiencies underlying these recommendations. The results of the follow-up review are summarized below.

OGE Finding: OGE reviewed documentation of IET in the first half of 2025 and determined of the 167 new Office of the Secretary employees, 97% received the training and 96% received the training within three months of their appointment, as required.
