As a result of its review of the National Archives and Records Administration's (NARA) ethics program, the U.S. Office of Government Ethics (OGE) issued three recommendations in its December 2024 review report. OGE conducted a follow-up review to assess whether NARA has taken sufficient action to resolve the deficiencies underlying these recommendations. The results of the follow-up review are summarized below.

	Recommendation	Agency Action and OGE Finding	Status
1	Ensure that confidential financial disclosure reports are certified timely.	OGE's examination of a sample of non-SGE confidential financial disclosure reports required in 2025 found that 87% (20 out of 23) were certified timely.	Closed
2	Ensure that all SGEs serving on the Public Interest Declassification Board (PIDB) submit their new entrant confidential financial disclosure reports timely.	OGE's examination of PIDB SGE board members' confidential financial disclosure reports required in 2025 found that 89% (8 out of 9) were filed timely.	Closed
3	Ensure that all SGE Board members receive ethics training timely.	In 2025, there were nine SGE board members that required ethics training. OGE's review of PIDB tracking documentation covering ethics training found that 100% (5 out of 5) SGE members already serving multiple year terms received ethics training as required in 2025 and 100% (4 out of 4) newly appointed SGE members received initial ethics training timely before their first meeting in 2025 as required.	Closed

Based on the results of OGE's follow-up review, all recommendations are closed.
