Dear Ms. Miller:

The United States Office of Government Ethics (OGE) recently conducted a follow-up review of the ethics program at the Peace Corps to determine whether the improvements recommended or suggested in our December 2011 report have been achieved. Our report on the initial review of the Peace Corps's ethics program included one recommendation addressing the loss or inability to access all of the 2011 confidential financial disclosure reports. Shortly after the fieldwork portion of the review, the Peace Corps had reconstituted approximately 92% of the missing reports. As part of our follow-up review, we examined the 2011 confidential financial disclosure master list and compared it to the reports filed and found that 95% of the missing reports have been reconstituted.¹ Based on this information, we have determined that the Peace Corps has adequately implemented the recommendation.

Based on our follow-up and as noted, we have closed the recommendation in our December 2011 report. Thank you for your assistance and cooperation during the follow-up process. Please contact me at 202-482-9317 if you require any additional information.

However, 10 of the 12 non-responsive filers subsequently filed their confidential financial disclosure 2012 reports; the remaining two filers are no longer employed at the Peace Corps.
